#### THREADS - WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

At the November meeting we had a very enjoyable illustrated talk given by Jan Gardiner of Lacewing Designs. Jan described the vast choice of threads for lacemaking suitable for big shawls to small size Honiton. The source of threads can be from animal, plant, fossil or mineral. She detailed the means of manufacturing of threads by spinning creating either S or Z twist, and the measuring of the weight of threads and yarns, which can be by denier, NE or the number of wraps per inch or centimetre. It was recommended to work a test piece if we were unsure of the suitability of the thread. Jan also gave us advice about breaking threads, a moist tea towel over the pillow if the cause is dry threads, which can happen when the thread is old. Jan was a very clear speaker and the time flew by with this fascinating talk.

### **JEAN NATHAN 1943 - 2023**

Long standing members of PBLC will remember Jean, who passed away in October after a long illness. Jean was a member of PBLC until 2014. I met Jean in 2007 when I joined. She belonged to the Moordown Community Group when it was tutored by Eileen Deacon and later, Jackie Barton, and remained a member when it became a self help group upon Jackie's retirement from teaching. She was still joining the group up until a few weeks before she went into Forest Holme hospice.



In 2004 she passed the Lace Guild's assessment course in Torchon at the



intermediate level. She enjoyed designing lace using a computer program Lace R-XP. Jean was a winner of the Rose Bowl in PBLC's 2005 competition, "Things Beginning with 'T', ' with her 'True Love Ring Pillow'. She contributed to 'Lace', the Lace Guild's newsletter, on three occasions: in issue 125 January 2007 with her 'Jack of Diamonds Playing Card' pattern; in issue 130 April 2008 'Anniversaries' with her patterns for Hallmarks originally designed for PBLC's silver anniversary and also in 131 July 2008 with a modular approach to design with a Wedding Garter.

Our sincere condolences go to Bill, her husband.

#### **VALDA DUNCAN 1936 – 2023**

Valda was another long standing member of PBLC, who passed away on October 4<sup>th</sup>. She was a modest lady, quiet and meticulous in her everything she did. After several years of learning bobbin lace, Valda took part in the 4 year Bobbin Lace Techniques Course. This demanded a great deal of time and commitment. She also made lace with the Ace Lacers, a local group, who were willing to step away from traditional patterns and experiment. Then she joined the self-help needlelace group which met in Broadstone Library. When the group had to move from Broadstone Library to Canford Heath Library, Valda ceased to attend as she didn't drive and was reluctant to ask for lifts. After leaving school Valda worked for a very well known jeweller in London, One of her responsibilities was stringing pearls. At one PBLC meeting she recounted the story of the Medici Pearls and their many owners from the royal families of Europe. In her early life Valda was a keen ballroom dancer and took it up again after the death of her husband. In memory of this, Glen Miller's recording of "String of Pearls" was played during Valda's funeral. Our condolences go to her daughters and grandchildren.

Both families requested that donations should be made in lieu of flowers and both chose Forest Holme as their charity. We will be making a combined collection for them at the meeting
