# **GROUP PIECE FOR DACA 2024.**

I hope that you have started on your butterfly for our Dorset Arts and Crafts Entry. If you weren't at the January meeting you may not know about it so I am putting it here so everyone will know.

We have decided to make butterflies to hang from, or to sit on, branches of a white twig tree. It will be called Kaleidoscope of Butterflies. Kaleidoscope is one of the names for a group of butterflies and is also associated with lots of bright colours.

Your butterfly should be no bigger than 3.5 inches at its widest point and can be any type of lace and any colour – the brighter the better. You may make as many butterflies as you like. If we get lots and lots we may not need to use all of them but will guarantee to put one on the tree for every member who gives some in. We need to receive them by the annual meeting on July 6th, but you can hand them in at any meeting.

I hope that you will enter some butterflies so that we can put an eye catching and colourful entry into DACA in August. *Jenny*
